In 2011, a pivotal moment unfolded at the Community Foundation of South Central Kentucky. Jennifer Wethington had just stepped into her role as the organization's first Executive Director when she received a lunch invitation from Shannon Vitale—a meeting that would spark a transformative initiative for women and families in the region.

Shannon had attended an event five years earlier in Nashville called Power of the Purse, hosted by the Middle Tennessee Community Foundation's Women's Fund. The concept was simple yet powerful: women pooling their resources to award grants to nonprofits serving women and children. Shannon had held onto that idea, waiting for the right time and the right partner to bring it to life in Bowling Green.

With Jennifer now in place at the Foundation, Shannon made her pitch. Inspired by the Nashville model, she envisioned a similar effort tailored to the needs of South Central Kentucky. The idea resonated immediately. Research began, and an advisory board was formed to lay the groundwork for what would become the Women's Fund of South Central Kentucky.

Shannon Vitale, the visionary behind the initiative, served as the Fund's first Chair. Together with Jennifer Wethington, she led the charge to create a sustainable, impactful program that would empower women philanthropically and support nonprofits making a difference in the lives of women, children, and families.

"Looking forward," Vitale said, "we envision a lasting legacy that continues to grow from our membership and endowment fund, allowing us to contribute to the inspiring ways our community is rising to meet the needs of its women and children."

Since its founding, the Women's Fund has grown into a vibrant force for change—building a strong membership base, growing its endowment, and awarding impactful grants to local organizations. What began as a lunch conversation has evolved into a legacy of generosity, leadership, and community transformation.

House on the Hill exists to provide affordable housing in community developments and transitional housing through The Guesthouse program, as well as access to fresh foods and groceries via The Grocery program, enhancing the quality of life for low-income individuals and families in our community. House on the Hill strives to become a model provider of affordable housing and transitional housing, and fresh groceries in our region for low-income households, fostering sustainable communities and economic empowerment.

In the year since they received the Women's Fund Award, House on the Hill has been hard at work to provide transitional housing to single mothers and fathers with children, students transitioning between high school and university, unhoused single adult women working to get back on track, women and men coming out of recovery programming working to re-establish themselves as they continue to practice their sobriety and others who are still awaiting a spot in The Guesthouse program.

A total of seven (7) unique households have been served since February 2025. The pilot family, who shared their story during the Women's Fund Annual Meeting 2024, have moved to their own housing and new schools within Warren County. They have made a new home with other nuclear family members and the last update indicated they are doing well. A number of other families received services from House on the Hill. These did not become residents in our Guesthouse program.

Since February 2025, one other household has left the program without completion. They decided the accountability and the program of their design was more than they wanted to work toward. The other 6 participants have been putting in the work and continue to work toward their individual goals. The high school senior has moved into student housing at Western Kentucky University pursuing a degree in Education. Two of our single mothers coming out of recovery have worked themselves into positions for promotion and higher wages and one is pursuing her degree in Medical Records. A single-women on Social Security Income has taken a part-time job dog sitting to make extra money to get ahead each month. Children are improving in school and have safe, healthy housing. While all the stories are hard to share in a small space of time, the residents themselves speak of The Guesthouse program as a safe place to begin again and to get back on track. Some call the program staff their second family. The programs success rate currently stands at

The award of the Women's Fund Grant has opened House on the Hill to a wider audience. They have been able to connect with more individuals, businesses and partners because of the notoriety placed on them. These new relationships have multiplied the value of the funds received enabling House on the Hill to provide for more households and expand programs outside of The Guesthouse program. While maintaining what has been accomplished through the Women's Fund Grant, they are working to expand the number of units available in the Guesthouse program, capitalizing on this recognition and new relationships with other Grantors.

Women's Fund Growth Grant and The Hive



With the support of the Women's Fund Growth Grant, The Hive has strengthened programs that directly impact women with intellectual and developmental disabilities and their families.

• QUEENS CLUB

This women-only social group has become a cornerstone of connection and empowerment. Members are building lasting friendships, increasing their confidence, and engaging in new opportunities in a safe and supportive environment. For many, Queens Club represents one of the few places where they feel truly seen and celebrated.

• CAREGIVER EMPOWERMENT GROUP

Parents and caregivers meet monthly to share experiences, encourage one another, and gain practical tools for daily life. What began as a space for conversation has grown into a strong network of support, helping caregivers feel less isolated and more equipped to meet challenges at home.

• YOUTH TRANSITION SUPPORT

The Hive has partnered with local schools to host field trips, giving students the chance to explore our clubhouse and begin envisioning life after graduation. These visits are an important first step in easing the transition from high school to adulthood.

This year's progress reflects our ongoing commitment to building spaces of belonging and empowerment. We are deeply grateful to the Women's Fund for making this work possible and for investing in brighter futures for women, caregivers, and families in our community.

* 8 organizations are selected for site visits.


* 4 finalists present their projects at the Annual Dinner.
